L'AFTER Financial Assistance Sheet

If you would like financial assistance for L'AFTER fees, please follow these steps to determine your payment rate:

1. Use the attached Income Eligibility Guidelines to determine if your family qualifies for free or reduced lunch. If so, be sure to submit a Free/Reduced Application to the school office so that you can access all the benefits for your family, and to help the school access funding. (Inquire at the front office if you need a form.)
- If you qualify for Free school lunch, your L'AFTER fees will be at a 10% rate.
 - If you qualify for Reduced school lunch, your L'AFTER fees will be at a 50% rate.
 - If your income is above the limit for Free/Reduced eligibility, you may still request financial assistance to pay at the 75% level.
